Dear graduate admissions committee,

I write to strongly recommend Orion Gee for admission to the Master of Environmental Studies program at the Evergreen State College. I taught Orion in *American Popular Music: A People's History* in the spring of 2022. The program was a social and cultural history of the United States focusing on popular music. Orion succeeded in this program at very high levels. Although the content of this program focused on history and cultural studies, his success in Evergreen's interdisciplinary, student-centered learning environment stands as excellent proof of his ability to succeed at similarly high levels in graduate study, especially around his interests in environmental studies.

Orion had perfect attendance in the program and was consistently a welcoming and constructive participant in class. Orion frequently asked productive questions and made insightful contributions to both large class meetings and small group conversations. In multiple in-class presentations, he shared his work confidently and comfortably and always engaged classmates at high intellectual levels.

Orion's written work in the program was outstanding. Not only is his writing thoughtful and clear, Orion always used the opportunity of doing assignments to explore his own interests, demonstrating curiosity and initiative. For his first major essay, Orion analyzed racist stereotypes against Native Americans in nineteenth-century sheet music. Orion's other assignments were similarly excellent. His essays had clear structures and engaging writing, and all of his work demonstrated good understanding of content, excellent historical analysis, sharp thinking, and strong communication skills.

The major project of the quarter could take the form of a traditional essay or a more creative project that students could develop on their own. Orion explored the independent musical genre called "Vada Vadam" based on a song from the band The Garden. He created a fun and engaging mix CD that demonstrated the genre's characteristics and boundaries. Orion also wrote explanatory notes for each song and a concluding essay that effectively incorporated analysis of the songs with a discussion of the wider technological, commercial, and cultural trends that independent music scenes both influence and exist within. This creative, thoughtful, and compelling project effectively reflected

the major themes of the program and demonstrated again Orion's ambition, initiative, and strong academic skills.

Although I only worked with Orion for one quarter, his academic work in *American Popular Music* was of such a high caliber that I know he will be able to thrive in Evergreen's MES program. He has already demonstrated an ability to write clearly, think sharply, research deeply, and communicate insights in a rigorous interdisciplinary academic environment. His dedication and initiative will serve him very well in any graduate program. His specific interests in tribal rights, environmental policy, sustainable agriculture, and horticulture make him an ideal candidate for Evergreen's MES. He is a strong student and is sure to succeed.
