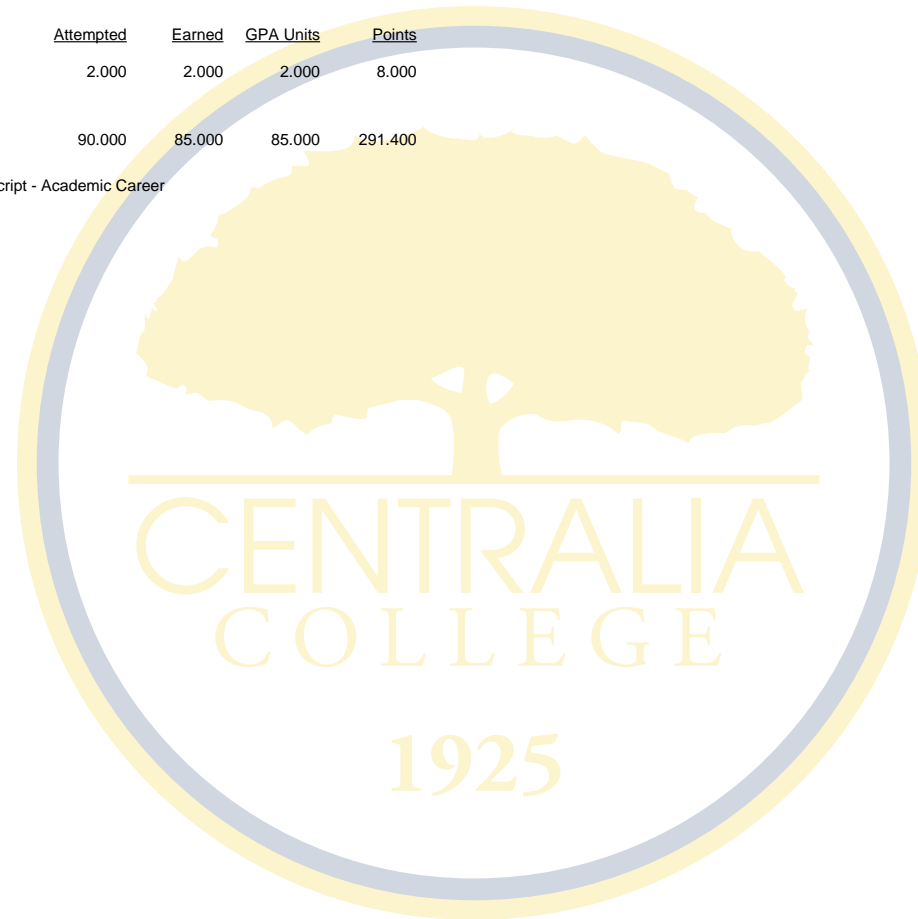

GRADING SYSTEM

Centralia College uses a numerical grading system with ranges from 4.0 to 0.0 in 0.1 increments. Other grades include S - Satisfactory, W - Withdrawal, WP - Withdrawal Passing, WF - Withdrawal Failing, I - Incomplete, Y - Course in progress, N - Audit, V - Unofficial Withdrawal, U - Unsatisfactory Progress, and * - No Grade Reported/Invalid Grade. Prior to summer quarter, 1987, the following grades were used: A, B, C, D, and F. Note: one of the following symbols may be printed to the immediate right of a grade: R - Course repeated, not computed in GPA and * - Grade Forgiveness Policy, not computed in GPA.

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) - Requires a minimum of 180 total college level credits including 60 credits in general university requirements and 60 credits in upper division course work. Students must complete all required coursework listed in the program plan for the specific BAS degree.

Associate in Arts - A transfer degree requiring a minimum of 90 quarter credits, courses numbered 100 and above, with 60 distributed among basic requirements, humanities, social sciences and natural sciences and a cumulative G.P.A. of 2.00 or above. From fall 1984 through spring 2000, the Associate in Arts degree followed by a pound symbol (#) indicated direct transfer degree conforming to the Intercollege Relations Commission (ICRC) guidelines. Effective fall 2000, the Associate in Arts degree followed by "DT A" indicates direct transfer degree that meets the ICRC Guidelines.

Associate in Liberal Arts - A liberal arts transfer degree requiring a minimum of 90 credits, courses numbered 100 and above, with a distribution of 75 credits including a minimum of 15 foreign language credits with a cumulative G.P.A. of 3.00 or above. This is a direct transfer degree that meets the ICRC Guidelines.

Associate in Science - Requires 90 quarter credits, courses numbered 100 and above, to meet pre-professional program requirements in a scientific

discipline with a cumulative G.P.A. of 2.00 or above. Since fall 2000, the Associate in Science is a direct transfer degree that meets the ICRC Guidelines.

Associate in Technical Arts - Associate in Applied Science - Requires a minimum of 90 quarter credits, courses numbered 100 and above, to meet specific vocational technical program requirements with a cumulative G.P.A. of 2.00 or above.

Associate in Applied Science - Transfer - A transfer degree requiring 90 credits, courses numbered 100 and above, in a specific vocational-technical program including 20 credits of general distribution requirements. The degree will transfer to specific baccalaureate programs based on articulation agreements.

Associate in General Studies - A non-transferable degree. See college catalog for degree requirements.

Certificate of Proficiency - Granted upon completion of a program of specialized occupational training.

COURSE NUMBERING

001 -089	Courses to build basic skills. Does not count towards a degree.
090 -099	Courses to meet certain vocational program requirements or to prepare students for entry into college level courses. Does not count towards a degree.
100 -299	Freshman and sophomore college level courses.
