Credits of any course with an "ADUP" or "DUPL" have been removed from units earned; grades from these courses are included in the calculation of the grade point average.

Residence credit is granted for students enrolled in the International Program of the California State University System and the National Student Exchange Program. RP Grades (SP through summer of 2002) were recorded as a placeholder for coursework taken through summer of 2003. Beginning fall 2003, the actual coursework is reflected once the grades have been received.

#### Extension/Open University

Courses taken through the College of Extended University are designated by a transcript note. Only 36 quarter/24 semester units of extension credit may be applied towards an undergraduate degree and only 12 quarter/8 semester units of extension credit may be applied towards a graduate degree.

#### **Transfer Credit Acceptability**

Acceptable transfer credit units by institution are indicated. However, a maximum of 105 quarter/70 semester community college units can be counted toward meeting the minimum units required for the baccalaureate degree; this total is reflected in the transfer credit summary.
