Pre-College credits are not eligible for Undergraduate credits.

CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS:

The value of each Continuing Education Course is stated in terms of continuing education units (CEU's). Point one (.1) CEU is equal to one hour of lecture or activity. The CEU represents contact hours of experience in a structured continuing education experience (class, seminar, retreat, practicum, etc.) that is instructed by a qualified continuing education provider. CEUs are not awarded for undergraduate academic credit and do not provide undergraduate academic credit and do not apply toward any degree or program of study. They may be awarded for a variety of experiences related to advancing knowledge and skills for a specific topic or occupation. CEU's are labeled "U" under the heading "CR TYPE." Starting Winter Quarter, 1998, all CEU course numbers are suffixed "U."
