Investigation of the Perception of Different Gender-Neutral Pronouns Apr 2022 University of Edinburgh

Descriptions are based on how someone is perceived—but according to research on gender-fair language reform, the reverse is true as well (Gustafsson Sendén et al., 2021; Lindqvist et al., 2018; Sczesny et al., 2015, 2016). Masculine forms of words in many languages around the world sometimes imply higher status or greater competency than the equivalent feminine forms, and stereotypes in many cases include an implication about the gender of the person (Gustafsson Sendén et al., 2021; Lindqvist et al., 2018; Sczesny et al., 2015). This paper takes its place in the gender-fair language debate by following the neutralization strategy, both for its inclusivity and ability to avoid existing stereotypes. It attempts to use the Bem Sex-Role Inventory (BSRI) to detect whether the pronoun used has an effect on the traits a person is perceived to have, both with *he* and *she* included and using a wide variety of gender-neutral personal pronouns. To that end, this paper provides an overview of the history of gender-fair language reform and its importance both in general and to the LGBTQ+ community in particular. This paper then discusses the development and usefulness of the BSRI as a tool for research into the gendered perception of language. Sections 2 and 3 are concerned with the study conducted as part of this paper, striving to address the following research questions:

- (1) Does the choice of gender-neutral pronoun change how the gendered traits of the person described are perceived?
- (2) If so, does this effect continue among LGBTQ+ respondents?
