To Whom it May Concern,

I am writing this letter of recommendation on behalf of Carrie Smith. I met Carrie last September at the beginning of Washington Native Plant Society's 2024 100hr Master Native Plant Stewardship Course which we both participated in. We shared 13 long and very full days of learning, and along with two others, formed a restoration team responsible for the adaptive management (over a 12-18 month period) of a one acre piece of land within the city of Federal Way's Steel Lake Park. The time, study, and effort that goes into the successful development, presentation, and implementation of such a plan is considerable, and so while the time I have known Carrie is brief, I feel more than qualified to speak to her merit as a potential graduate student at The Evergreen State College.

In the classroom setting I found Carrie to be ever attentive, kind (with instructors and classmates alike) and genuinely engrossed in the varied curriculum. She is an eager leaner and clearly passionate about the natural world and the impacts and responsibilities of we humans within it. She's a tremendously hard worker and you can be sure this translates out into the field as well - unafraid to get dirty, she can grub out blackberries like nobody's business!

I was so pleased when Carrie told me that she was applying for a Master's of Environmental Studies program. Clearly I'm her fan, and while I would like to tell you that I have nothing to gain by being so, I'm not actually sure that's true - I believe that Carrie possesses an ethic and constitution such that she would do good work, whatever she did, and yet I think here, given the potential schooling, resources, and connections, she is being presented with an opportunity to go out in the world and do genuine good, which I believe she will. And all of us, who live and breathe, who love this precious and wounded world, stand to benefit from that.

I feel lucky to be on her team and I wholeheartedly believe she is worthy of being granted admission.
