INCOMPLETE GRADES may be given to students who because of illness or other circumstances, have not been able to complete a course in the prescribed amount of time.

It is expected that the student will have completed the work within an eight week period from the beginning of the next semester (excluding summer).

The grade of “I” will not be computed in calculating the Grade Point Average. If the work is not completed within the prescribed time, the “I” grade will be changed to an “F” and will be computed into the Grade Point Average.

TIME EXTENDED GRADES may be given in a few selected courses to students who require more than three weeks to complete the course requirements following the assignment of the grade. Such students will be expected to re-enroll and pay tuition for the course which they are seeking to complete.

Normally, re-enrollment to remove the “TE” grade should be in the semester immediately following the assignment of the grade; however, this is at the discretion of the department and students are encouraged to consult their instructor for a definite decision. Records of student performance will be kept for two years to facilitate student re-enrollment to remove a “TE” grade. The “TE” will remain on the student’s transcript.
