General Information and Evaluation Terms

Institute of Foreign Credential Services, Inc. (IFCS) provides timely and accurate credential evaluations and translations for individuals who have completed all or part of their education outside the United States.

Evaluation Terms

IFCS evaluations are based on standards and practices recommended by The National Council on the Evaluation of Foreign Academic Credentials, standards adopted by most U.S. universities, and placement recommendations, contained in the American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admission Officers (AACRAO). IFCS maintains a comprehensive library of materials associated with the evaluation of foreign and domestic credentials.

General Analysis reports provide an overall equivalency of each credential.

Course by Course reports provide a listing of courses, semester credits hours, grades, and an overall grade point average.

Course Level Designation: In comprehensive and health professions course by course reports, credits bear divisional designations as follows; L= lower division, U= upper division, G= graduate.

Grades/Quality points: IFCS uses letter grades based on a 4.0 system. The standard conversion of letter grades is as follows: A = 4.00; A = 3.67; B + = 3.33; B = 3.00; B - = 2.67; C + = 2.33; C = 2.00; C - = 1.67; D + = 1.33; D = 1.00; F = 0.00. Pass is equivalent to at least a "C" or better and is not included in the GPA. A grade point average (GPA) is calculated by multiplying the credits per course by the quality points for the grade of the course, repeating this procedure for each course, totaling the credit hour quality points obtained, and dividing by the total number of credits.

Credits on IFCS evaluations are reported in semester credit hours as granted by U.S. universities accredited by one of the six regional accrediting associations. One semester credit hour requires 15-16 lecture hours or 30-45 of lab/practical instructions.

IFCS evaluations are advisory in nature and in no way limit the accepting institution in making its own determination as to the level of education and credits allowed for the foreign credential.
