I have worked with Valeria at the Environmental Science Center (ESC) for many years; she was hired as a naturalist in 2020, but even before that had been a dedicated volunteer. I have worked with Vale both as a fellow naturalist and in a supervisory position, as I transitioned from being a naturalist to being the Programs Coordinator in August of 2020.

Vale has been an invaluable member of the ESC team since she first started volunteering. She is patient and present when working with all participants, particularly young children.
