The area I intend to teach upon completion of the Master in Teaching program will be Elementary K-8. I truly feel that my life experiences have built upon each other in a way that will allow me to easily transition into a formal educator of young students. Not only do I have some base knowledge of early childhood and elementary education knowledge acquisition from a scholarly standpoint, I also have first hand experience in classrooms and with young children. Apart from that, I have had much positive social input from educators, family, and friends that point out how well suited I am for a career in elementary education. While the former may not seem like much, it adds a layer of belief in myself that I am pursuing a suitable path for my own character.

To expand upon my strengths in preparation let me go into a bit more detail about the first hand work I have done in classrooms. To fulfill my Bachelor in Early Childhood Development requirements I completed many hours of field work in daycares/preschools, headstarts, elementary schools, as well as teaching English abroad in China with a variety of ages. Some areas of growth that I need in relation to real life experiences in education would definitely be just more experience in K-8 classrooms settings. Learning the before, during, and aftersmeaning what it takes from the start of the school year through to the end; how to set up a classroom most efficiently, how to plan lessons that align with standards, and how to work with different types of learners all in the same classroom. I need first hand experiences doing these things under supervision so that I am able to confidently do it on my own eventually.
