DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

Degrees require a minimum of 90 credits and 2.00 cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) for graduation. Certificate requirements vary with program.

The Associate of Arts Degree is the associate degree which conforms to the Inter-College Relations Commission (ICRC) AA guidelines. The use of the pound (#) sign identifies ICRC conforming AA degrees awarded between Fall Quarter 1984 and Summer Quarter 1999. In Fall Quarter 1999, the Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA) notation went into effect to indicate degrees meeting ICRC guidelines.

Academic Honors

A Dean's/Vice President's and/or President's List is compiled at the end of each academic quarter to recognize outstanding student achievement. The Dean's/Vice President's List requires 12 credits of graded coursework with a GPA of 3.60-3.99. The President's List requires 12 credits of graded coursework with a GPA of 4.00. Students who qualify for Dean's/Vice President's and/or President's List receive a congratulatory letter, a certificate and a notation on their permanent record.

High Honors is awarded at graduations for a GPA 3.75-3.89.

Highest Honors is awarded at graduation for a GPA of 3.9-4.0.
