To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is to recommend Samantha Nannetti for admittance to TESC's Master's in Teaching program. Samantha was a highly motivated student in my "Exploring the Literature of Empowerment: Rising Above the Subaltern" undergraduate program in 2021. She consistently reflected upon her ideas and questions specific to literature, race, culture, language, class and gender. She demonstrated a strong understanding of this interdisciplinary content through the completion of the readings, reflective papers, weekly seminar discussions and a final research presentation via Zoom due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Samantha positively contributed to class discussions and seminars in ways that reflected her inquiry and analysis of 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> century African American, Latinx, LGBTQIA and East Asian-American literature. She offered a strong understanding of historical contexts, major themes and conflicts through dialogue and group collaborations. Samantha also completed analysis activities through the detailed written and oral discussions of our program readings and the successful completion of synthesis essays, dialectical journals, a reading log and the drawing of literary maps.

Samantha and her research team conducted a final presentation about the authors, Tommy Orange and Toni Morrison. With outstanding leadership, she guided her collaborative team research on racism, pain and decolonization. Her team discussed their writing different styles and noted their connections to media and storytelling. Samantha's team presented biographies of Orange, a citizen of Cheyenne and Arapaho Nation of Oklahoma, who grew up in Oakland, while Morrison lived most of her youth in Ohio following her family's move during the "great migration" north following the U.S. Civil War.

Samantha's team also incorporated the discussion of identity and colonization within this final presentation. Connecting the work of Orange and Morrison, Samantha effectively shared an analysis of the representation of children in the literature and how their characters were uprooted, traumatized, yet fought to resist. The team's final presentation included artistic representations of the authors' work, well-selected quotes for deeper analysis and MLA references for further support.

In sum, Samantha's positive collaborative workshops, seminar, literary research and presentation, demonstrate she is an excellent candidate for the MiT program.
