Alexis Payne How My Corse Work Has Prepared me for Teaching Many courses that I have taken have helped me connect the material to preparing to teach. Some of the courses that have prepared me include In Sickness and in Health, and child development. In Sickness and in Health helped me learn about factors that shape individuals life experiences. It also helped me get involved with the community to experience certain issues. I was able to learn about how race, location, culture, and government impact health. A lot of the information that I learned about is traced back to childhood and prior. Factors such as class, access to health care and education can affect the ways that children are raised and how they find their belong in society. A big area that I focused on during this class was how personal circumstances and environmental factors impact wellbeing. In order to be successful and healthy people need to live in an area that supports them. Gaining access to resources is required for good health. We discussed how lacks in resources creates barriers to health. Barriers like lack of food, or unstable living conditions can affect the development of children and shape their futures. Access to resources, good health and community are factors that support health. I was able to explore my goals and use the knowledge that I gained to get a job. When I came to Evergreen, I felt good around the people in my class, but I didn't feel connected with the rest of Evergreen. As part of my final project, my instructors

required everyone to find a job that related to my career goals. I wasn't very confident about getting a job. I want to become a teacher so I reached out to the Evergreen Children's Center. I thought that it would be good experience. I ended up going through the interview process and worked they're for a few months. I really enjoyed my work and my coworkers. The goal of connecting my course work with my work was to build a sense of community and belonging. During my work I was able to identify class concepts to my experiences. We talked a lot about diversity and inclusion in class which is a core value at the Childcare center. There is a diverse range of staff and students who are accepting of each other. This made me feel good and fit in more. I was worried that my blindness would impact my work, but the people there helped me feel good about being there. Child Development also helped me decide to teach. Taking child development classes have also prepared me for teaching. I took two different child development courses which helped me gain an understanding of the stages of growth. The first class that I took was modified because of the Covid-19 pandemic. Most of the work was different methods for observing and encouraging development. I also had the opportunity to compare different teaching styles like traditional public school and Montessori. I learned that all kids are different and how to observe and identify different methods for learning. I took a class on childhood education which focused teaching and stages of development for different age groups. This also involved field work and journaling. I was placed at a school and was required to identify and implement activities that covered different types of growth. I worked in math, language arts, and art classes with elementary and middle schoolers. This gave me first hand experience of working in a classroom. Taking classes in childhood development and education, as well as in Sickness and in Health helped me learn about factors that shape and influence Children's experiences.

Alexis Payne Prompt B: How My Life experience has prepared me for Teaching Many of my experiences have influenced my decision to become an elementary school teacher. As a teenager I had volunteered in a few elementary schools and enjoyed my time there. I had also babysat and helped with afterschool care, but elementary education felt right for me. I enjoyed the interactions with students and preparing class material. Another experience that influenced my choice was helping my nephews in school. I have helped my nephews with their classwork and have visited their classes in the past. Helping and seeing them grow was important to me and helped me gain new knowledge on teaching. My volunteer work and education has helped prepare me for my career in teaching. I have been able to get a feel of what it is like to work in the classroom. I also have some friends who are teachers who I have also had discussions with about teaching. My areas of growth include organization and networking. Knowing where to start is a challenge that I have experienced when starting a job. I have trouble knowing where to start, or what lessons would be good to start with. When I have worked with students before I was thrown into a situation where everything was planned, and I needed to do what I was told. I didn't have a say in what was taught. I have improved with this at my job with Evergreen's Childcare Center. I have been able to help assess and plan activities based on areas of development. Networking is another area where I could improve on is networking and getting help. I get anxious at times which makes reaching out challenging. This is something that I will work on. I think that a good first step would be to reach out to people that I know, and expand from there. These are some areas that I need to improve on in order to work in education. My next steps include getting accepted to a teaching program and applying my knowledge to my work. I am close to completing my BA degree and I plan to enter a teaching program to further my education. I am currently working with the campus children's center where I will continue to apply my current understanding of development and education. I think that entering the MIT program will help me focus my work on the area that I intend to teach and gain a strong foundation in this area. After college I plan to look for work teaching in a public school. I hope that this will help me expand my knowledge on elementary education so that I can be a better teacher.

Prompt C: Education is both a social good and structurally unjust. Explain your understanding of this contradiction and ways it can be addressed.

Alexis Payne Prompt C Education provides children with the opportunity to learn and interact with peers, although may not treat all students with equity and inclusion. Many kids attending school have different abilities and learn in different ways. It is great that so many kids are able to attend school, but many are treated differently based on individual factors. Different factors such as race, ethnicity, disability, or even basic understanding can impact how children learn, and how they are treated. Certain advantages or disadvantages can cause children to fall behind and be ostracized by adults. The expectations that are put on kids to learn the same way needs to be changed. Accepting that everyone learns differently can help educators prepare information in ways that benefits all students. Differences need to be taken into account in schools. Making information accessible to students can reduce stress and help kids feel at ease with school. Kids who have a disability may learn at a different pace, or may need special aids to keep up with their peers. Adapting lessons could prevent children from falling behind or feeling left out. Another way to understand students is by speaking to families about hthe best approach to these situations. This could help educators understand their students and how to approach challenging situations. Making these changes could help more kids feel accepted and understood in school. While many schools struggle with structural challenges, changing the way that information is delivered and getting to know students can help them improve understanding of material and make more kids feel accepted in education. This would create a positive environment and boost confidence.
