I have known Jackie since 2000, when he arrived on Evergreen's campus. During that time, I was serving as the Vice President for Student Affairs at the College. In 2000, Evergreen initiated a men's basketball program and Jackie was a member of that first team. For the past four years, Jackie has been working with at-risk students at Olympia High School helping them to reach academic milestones required for graduation. He did all of this while continuing to coach basketball at the high school level, now serving in a new role as Head Women's Basketball Coach at Evergreen.
