Explanation of Transcript

Semester System: Effective Fall 1991, Montana State University operates on semester term system consisting of three semesters in a year: fall, spring, and summer. Each regular academic semester is approximately 15 weeks in length.

Quarter system: Prior to fall 1991, Montana State University operated on a quarter term system, consisting of four quarters in a year: summer, autumn, winter and spring. Each regular academic quarter was approximately 11 weeks in length.

EXPLANATION OF GRADES AND METHODS OF RECORDING

I: A grade of "I" indicates an incomplete course. To be eligible to receive the grade of "I," the student must have completed three-fourths of the course work with a passing grade.

F: An "F" grade may be made up only by repeating the course; however, the original grade and course will remain on the transcript.

T (with grade): A "T" joined with a letter grade indicates a transfer grade and is not included in the GPA calculation. Transfer credits are applied to a degree.

* (with grade): An "*" joined with a letter grade indicates a below college level course and no credit is granted.

Repeated Courses

When a course is repeated, an "E" (excluded) is recorded beside the points of the repeated subject to indicate that the course has been repeated and that all points, hours, and credits are excluded from GPA calculations. An "I" (included) is recorded beside the points of a repeated course and all points, hours, and credits are included in calculations.

GPA

All grade-point averages are computed on the number of credits carried except for credits with grades "P," "I," "W," or "WP." GPA is the result of GPA hours divided by quality points. After July 1, 1974, only the last repeated course will be included in the calculations of the cumulative GPA.

Miscellaneous Information

- Courses numbered 001-099 are below university level. No credit is counted toward a degree.
- Graduate Credit—all 500 and above numbered courses are graduate level. A limited number of 400 level courses are
 accepted in a graduate program.

Transcript Requests

Transcripts are sent only upon the written authorization of the student.

Continuing Education Unit (CEU)

One CEU is defined as 10 contact hours of participation in an organized continuing education experience under responsible sponsorship, capable direction and qualified instruction. A CEU is not applicable to, nor can it be translated into, credits for a degree.
