ACCREDITATION AND MEMBERSHIP

The university is accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU). Some programs have been accredited by specialized accrediting associations, including the Technology Accreditation Commission of the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (TAC/ABET); American Chemical Society (ACS) Committee on Professional Training; American Council for Construction Education (ACCE); American Dietetic Association Commission on Accreditation for Diabetics Education (CADE-ADA); the Committee on Accreditation of Educational Programs for the EMS-Professions (CoAEMSP); National Association of School Psychologists (NASP); National Association of Schools of Music (NASM); National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA); National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE); and U.S Government Printing Office Federal Depository Library Program (U S GPOFDLP).

RECORDS SYSTEM

In January 1986, CWU adopted an electronic records system. Students enrolled prior to Winter 1986 have separate transcripts reflecting their previous course work.

CLASS STANDING

Undergraduate students are classified by level based on credit hours earned plus transfer credit, if applicable.

Freshman 0-44.9 credits
Sophomore 45.0-89.9 credits
Junior 90.0-134.9 credits
Senior 135.0 or more credits

Students holding a bachelor's degree are considered post-baccalaureate status if they are pursuing a second undergraduate degree or a certification program. If they are admitted to a master's program, they are considered graduate student status.

COURSE NUMBERING SYSTEM

IP In Progress: Used when the student was not able to be evaluated by the end of the term, usually because instruction is not yet completed.

TRANSCRIPT NOTATIONS

Advance Placement Credits- (AP) – Students may receive credits for high school advanced placement examinations. Subject areas and earned credit are noted on transcript.

Emergency Pass/Fail- (EP/EF) – Provides an alternative to a letter grade in a major campus emergency. Courses graded with a C- or better will be converted to a passing grade of EP and meet all graduation requirements. Courses graded with a D+ or lower shall be converted to EF and the student will not earn credit.

Credit by Exam - Students may challenge specific coursework and receive a "Satisfactory" grade.

TRANSFER CREDIT

Grades for work transferred from another institution are not recorded.

Military Credits - Credits may be granted for military service upon proof of service and/or schooling.

Vocational Technical Credits – Under certain conditions the University will grant up to 45 credits for matriculated students who have had experience in industry.

College Level Examination Program (CLEP) – Test scores at 50th percentile or above accepted in some subject areas.

QUARTER CREDITS

180 credits are required for graduation with a minimum 2.00 grade point average.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE

Grade point averages will be calculated by dividing grade points earned by the credit hours attempted. AHRS; Attempted Hours EHRS; Earned Hours

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
