Prior to Fall 2007, only grades of "D" and "F" grades may be repeated. When the same course is repeated, the higher grade will be calculated in the GPA.

Effective Fall 2007, only grades of "C-" or lower may be repeated. When the same course is repeated, the most recent grade will be calculated in the GPA.

Effective Fall 2008, grades for graduate courses are included in calculation of quality point average (GPA):

Effective Fall 2016, only grades of "B-" or lower may be repeated. When the same course is repeated, the most recent grade will be calculated in the GPA.

Effective Fall 2019, Academic Fresh Start Policy. Only courses taken after Fresh Start readmission will count toward the GPA. Previous courses in which a grade of C- (1.7) or better was earned will count as transfer credit toward graduation requirements but will not factor into the student's GPA. Under the Fresh Start policy, students must complete at least eight (8) FSU courses, five (5) in the major, with an overall GPA of 2.00 in order to receive an undergraduate degree from FSU. The Fresh Start policy may be exercised only once. Once a student exercises the Fresh Start, it may not be rescinded. The student's academic transcript will note the readmission status as Academic Fresh Start along with the semester the status commenced.

Grades not included in the calculation of GPA:

AU – Audit	(WP – Withdrawn Passing) No longer used
NG – Non-Graded	(WF – Withdrawn Failing) No longer used
W – Withdrawn from Course	WX – Withdrawn from University

P/F (Pass/Fail): Each student may take two undergraduate credit-bearing courses within the total thirty-two on the pass/fail basis. Only open to Juniors and Seniors (See University catalog for further conditions). A grade of Pass is a grade of D- or higher. A Fail grade is calculated in the GPA as an "F" grade.

Effective for the Spring 2020 Semester, due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, all undergraduate coursework may be selected by the student to be recorded as Pass/Fail. A grade of Pass is a grade of D- or higher.

S/U or SA/UN (Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory): These grades are used for the Student Teaching Practicum (Education Department). S or SA is considered Credits at Pass, U or UN is considered a failed grade and is included in the grade point average.

## ACADEMIC HONORS (Baccalaureate Degree Candidates Only)

Dean's List:

(Semester based) The designation "Dean's List" is recorded on the transcripts of those undergraduate students who, each semester, have met the following criteria:

Prior to Fall 2013 – registered for four (4) credit-bearing courses and earned a GPA of 3.25 or higher.  
Fall 2013 and after – registered for three (3) credit-bearing courses and earned a GPA of 3.30 or higher.

President's List:

(Semester based) The designation "President's List" is recorded on the transcripts of those undergraduate students who have met the following criteria:

Prior to Fall 2013 – registered for four (4) credit-bearing courses and have been on the Dean's List for three (3) consecutive semesters.  
Fall 2013 and after – registered for three (3) credit-bearing courses and have been on the Dean's List for three (3) consecutive semesters.

Graduation Latin Honors:

To be eligible for graduation Latin honors, a student must have completed a minimum of 16 course-credits at Framingham State University, and must never have incurred loss of good standing for academic or disciplinary reasons. The baccalaureate degree is conferred with honors upon a student with a final quality point average of:

## STATEMENT OF GRADUATION

Degrees are conferred and posted to the academic record four times each year (effective Academic Year 1999) following the summer, fall, winter, and spring semesters/terms. The graduation requirement for undergraduates is a minimum of thirty-two course-credits. The minimum number of course-credits required for a Master's degree varies by program. A graduation date is posted to the record upon completion of all degree requirements.

## COURSE-CREDIT

With the introduction of the Course-Credit system in 1971-72, each Course-Credit is equivalent to four (4) semester hours (sixty (60) contact hours) for internal and external transfer use. There is no differentiation made in Course-Credit value between courses that require laboratory or studio work and those that do not. Only courses and Course-Credit equivalents accepted for transfer by the University are indicated on the academic transcript.  
Professional Development Graduate coursework (not applicable to FSU graduate programs requirements), 70000-level, will appear as 1.00, .75, .50, or .25 Course-Credits. This relates to four (4), three (3), two (2), and one (1) semester hour(s).

## TRANSFER COURSES

Undergraduate Coursework:

Transfer credit is awarded for only those courses in which the student received a grade of C- (1.70 on a 4.0 scale) or better. Grades from the transfer courses will not be computed in the GPA

Graduate Coursework:

Transfer credit is awarded for only those courses in which the student received a grade of B- (2.70 on a 4.0 scale) or better and is limited to two (2) graduate courses. Grades from the transfer courses will not be computed in the GPA

## COURSE LEVELS

Effective September 1978, the University revised the course numbering system:

000-099	Non-credit courses (includes remedial course work).
100-199	Courses that are introductory in nature, assuming no college-level exposure in the discipline.
200-299	Courses appropriate for students with prior exposure to the college regimen and/or exposure to the discipline, some with prerequisites.
300-499	Upper-level courses that build upon previous exposure to the discipline, most with prerequisites.
600-699	Courses for public service undergraduate credit (not for degree programs – Exceptions may be made by Major Department Chair).
70000-79999	Courses for public service and professional development graduate credit (not for degree programs at Framingham). Effective Fall 2008, a course number will be five characters in length.
800-999	Assigned to graduated level courses.
