In our learning community, she thoughtfully reflected upon her ideas and questions specific to culture, language, class and gender. She demonstrated an effective understanding of interdisciplinary instruction with the completion of the readings, reflective journals and weekly ML tutoring sessions.

Laura successfully participated and completed over 20 hours of ML tutoring and observation sessions at a local elementary and secondary school.
