An I or IP is counted in the attempted credit hours; however, they are not included in the calculation of the GPA or total credit hours earned. If not completed, a course with I or IP changes to a pre-assigned default grade, or to an F or NC, which is then included in the GPA calculation.

# **TERM COURSE VALUE 1967-1973**

Withdrawal

Prior to 1967, all credit was granted in semester hours. In September 1967, a term course system was implemented without reference to quarter or semester hours. Each course carried a term course value of 1.00. Conversion from term to semester hours:

In June 1973, the University returned to a semester hour system.
