Explanation of Transcripts

ACCREDITATION: Cornell College is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, the Iowa State Department of Education, the American Chemical Society, and the University Senate of the United Methodist Church.

COURSE CREDIT: Since September 1963, <u>1.0 credit equals 4 semester hours or 6 quarter hours</u>. Students must earn 31 credits to graduate. Transfer courses not equivalent to specific Cornell College courses are numbered 01X for 100 level, 02X for 200 level, and 03X for a 300 level course. A total of 11 credits must be earned for the Master of Fine Arts in Creative Writing.

DEGREES: Cornell College offers five types of Bachelor level degrees. Bachelor of Arts; Bachelor of Fine Arts in Musical Theatre; Bachelor of Music in Music Education or in Music Performance; Bachelor of Science in Engineering; Bachelor of Special Studies. Cornell College offers one type of Master's level degree. Master of Fine Arts in Creative Writing.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR: From September 1978 through August 2016 the academic year is called Full and is named by the year in which it begins, including all courses completed between the Fall start date and end of following Spring. Beginning September 2016 the academic calendar is based on the semester system divided into a Fall and a Spring semester, with an optional Summer semester.

ONE-COURSE-AT-A-TIME-PLAN: Effective September 1978, students take one principal course for 3 1/2 weeks, (or 18 class days) for eight terms (nine terms prior to 2012). Adjunct courses (numbered in the 500s or 700s) usually involve at least 4 terms (a semester) and are taken in conjunction with principal or concurrent courses. All MFA program students are considered full-time, taking 1.5 credits per term. No partial credit for a term is awarded; students who receive an incomplete will be considered to have earned no credit unless the incomplete is replaced by a credit per terms of the incomplete status.

COURSE NUMBERING: Courses numbered 100-400= undergraduate courses. Numbered 500 and 700= undergraduate adjunct courses. Adjunct courses are partial-credit (0.25 or 0.5) courses taken over the course of a semester at the same time the student is enrolled in full-credit block long courses.

GRADING SYSTEM: A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+, C, C-, D+, D, D-, P, S, SD, and CR are passing grades. F, NC, and U denote failure. AU indicates a course audited for no credit. I indicates work of satisfactory quality which is "Incomplete." W signifies withdrawal, and may appear alone, followed by the grade the student has earned at the time of withdrawal (prior to September 1974), by H if for reasons of health or counseling, or by R if by default for non-attendance. IP indicates a course in progress or grade not reported. A repeated course, indicated by 'R' (after the course), or by a grade in brackets [], carries graduation credit only when specified in the course description.

Graduate courses in the Master of Fine Arts program are graded either as Credit (CR) if the instructor certifies that the student has done work of "B" quality (3.0) or better, or as No Credit (NC) if the student fails to achieve the minimum standard.

Effective September 1972

4 point scale used for quality points:

A = 4, A = 3.7, B + = 3.3, B = 3, B = 2.7,

C+ = 2.3, C = 2, C- = 1.7, D+ = 1.3, D = 1, D- = .7, F = 0.

No points are assigned for P, S, U, CR, or NC.

Effective February 1965

4 point scale used for quality points:

A = 4, B = 3, C = 2, D = 1, F = 0. All subsequent grades reflect this change and cumulative

averages computed after this date are on the 4 point scale.

Prior to February 1965

3 point scale used for quality points:

A = 3, B = 2, C = 1, D = 0, F = -1.

CR/NC

CR (Credit) and NC (No Credit) are not a grading option exercised by the student except for courses so designated in the catalogue. CR

signifies work of C quality or better, NC, failure.

P/F

P (Pass) and F (Failure) were student grading options from September 1968 to May 1970. P was the equivalent of D or higher and was not

computed in the grade point average, but F was.

S/U

S (Satisfactory) and U (Unsatisfactory) were student grading options between September 1970 and May 1976. S was Equivalent to a C- or

higher; U to D+ or lower. Neither grade was computed in the grade point average. This option was reestablished as of the 2013 academic year

with S being equivalent to a C or higher and was used until July 2020.

S/SD/NC

S/SD/NC is a student grading option that became effective August 2020. When a student has selected this option, a grade of C- or above becomes an S (Satisfactory), a grade of D+, D, or D- becomes an SD (Satisfactory - D), and a grade of F becomes an NC (No Credit). Grades of S and SD ensure credit toward graduation but do not affect grade-point averages. A grade of NC does not confer credit, nor does it affect the

grade-point average.

TRCR denotes transfer credit from another institution.
