My intentions to teach elementary education have been ignited by the past eleven years as an educational support professional, most currently in kindergarten. I have worked in a special education classroom, more specifically, a highly supported Kindergarten (HSK) classroom, supporting a general education class with two to four identified, high needs students. Those high needs were identified through their early learning years, needing support in areas of cognitive, social, speech and/or behavior.
