INCOMPLETE: An incomplete becomes an "F" if the work is not completed by the last day of classes of the following regular semester, or if the postponed work has not been completed satisfactorily by the date specified by the instructor. A degree will not be conferred if an incomplete grade is on a student's

TRANSFER: Credits earned through transfer work are reflected by a grade of "T" and are not calculated into the W&M GPA.

WITHDRAWAL: All attempted coursework appears on the transcript. Generally, students may withdraw from a course through the 60 percent point of classes. Refer to the catalog for specific withdrawal policies.

REPEATED COURSES: With the exception of courses that are specifically designated in the catalog, no course in which a student receives passing, incomplete or deferred grade may be repeated except as an audit. Any course in which a student receives a grade of "F", "R" or "W" may be repeated for a grade. If a course with a grade of "F" is repeated, both the original grade of "F" and the grade earned in the repeated course will be included in calculating the student's GPA.

COURSE NUMBERS: Course numbers below 300 are generally considered "lower-level" undergraduate courses and those numbered between 300 and 499 are generally considered "upper-level" undergraduate courses. Courses numbered 500 and above are considered graduate courses, as are all courses with a CRIN, EPPL or LAW prefix. Non-credit course subjects and numbers begin with 9

ACADEMIC CREDIT HOUR: A credit hour is generally equivalent to one hour of direct faculty instruction, plus out of class student work, each week for approximately 15 weeks. W&M employs federal and state definitions of

academic credit: when contact hours differ from credit hours, the courses use demonstration of competency, demonstration of proficiency, or fulfillment of learning outcomes to establish credit.

GRADING SYSTEM and GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA): W&M uses a four point grading system. A student's GPA is calculated by dividing the sum of earned quality points by the sum of attempted hours for all courses receiving a grade used in calculating the GPA. Only coursework taken at W&M is used in the GPA calculation. Non-credit courses are graded, but no quality points are earned

W&M used a three point grading system prior to Fall 1976. The graduate schools of business and education used the three point system through Summer 1977. The law school adopted a 12-point scale from Fall 1989 to Spring 2003 in which GPAs were calculated by dividing total quality points by total hours, divided by three. The current law grading system was adopted Summer 2003.
