Many presented portions of their stories in English while transitioning to their native languages to ensure their families fully understood their narratives. This ability to express complex ideas in both languages demonstrated their language skills, creativity, and understanding.

Ms. Dunn's use of bilingual resources and visual aids made complex lessons accessible to all students. I admired how she engaged multilingual learners through collaborative activities that honored their linguistic backgrounds. These observations taught me that effective teaching involves more than delivering content; it's about creating connections and recognizing the strengths each student brings to the classroom.

Growing up in a family where my parents didn't have the opportunity to attend college often left me uncertain about my own path. Despite this, I always felt a deep passion for education and its transformative power. Working alongside Ms. Dunn reinforced this passion, as her commitment to creating an inclusive environment showed me the profound impact a teacher can have on young lives. She inspired me to believe in my potential to make a meaningful difference, motivating me to pursue a career in education with greater determination.

These experiences have significantly informed my decision to apply to the Integrated Multilingual Learner Pathway. I want to develop strategies that build on students' linguistic and cultural strengths, allowing them to thrive academically and socially. I am particularly interested in creating inclusive lesson plans that reflect the diverse backgrounds of my future students.
