


Dear Principal and Cooperating Teacher,

I want to cultivate curiosity and excitement about learning by showing students that every area of study can be related to a subject they enjoy. I think it is important for students to understand both the material and their process, and I believe this occurs through discussion, reflection, social interaction and creation. I think an educator's job is to help students find and form these types of connections between existing knowledge, new material and the process, through authentic learning activities and experiences. Most of all, I believe that my job as an educator is to share a love of learning with my students, and to cultivate creativity and curiosity in each of them.

I enjoy all of the time I spend in the classroom. Every day I spend at my current student teaching placement, I take the opportunity to learn as much as I can from the students and teachers there. I look forward to having this new opportunity for growth, to share what I can with the students while learning from them, and to learn from your community.
