Congratulations! I am pleased to inform you, upon recommendation by the Graduate Program on the Environment Admissions Committee, that you have been accepted into the Fall 2020 cohort for the Master of Environmental Studies (MES) degree at The Evergreen State College. You are no longer considered a waitlisted student and I hope you are able to join us!

Important notifications from the college and MES will be sent to your Evergreen email address periodically, so be sure to set it up immediately and check it regularly. Directions are enclosed. Starting now, we will send out paid internships, jobs, and other opportunities for MES students to your Evergreen email address. As a new MES student, you are required to enroll in the first MES core class: graduate Conceptualizing our Regional Environment, or gCORE. All core courses are on Tuesdays and Thursdays, 6-10pm. If you intend to finish in two years, you should also take an elective course along with gCORE. Fall registration is open as of June 1<sup>st</sup>! You will be able to register for gCORE and an elective of your choice through your my.evergreen student account, once it's setup. You may also take summer 2020 courses with MES as a special (non-matriculated) student – up to eight credits of these courses will count toward your degree. This year, the Fall quarter starts on September 29<sup>th</sup>. We will hold a mandatory orientation on Monday, September 21<sup>st</sup>, 2020. All new students are required to participate. In mid-August, we will send more details about orientation, and the fall quarter by email and postal mail if you have accepted this offer of admission.

If you applied for MES aid and/or filled out your FAFSA, you will receive a separate message letting you know if you received an award from MES. Loan awards, tuition waivers, and Evergreen Need Grants (residents only) will be sent to you by the Financial Aid office and will come later. If you did not apply for aid or did not fill out your FAFSA, you will still be eligible for loans by filling out your FAFSA at any time.



Go to <u>fafsa.ed.gov</u> to apply. MES will host another scholarship application cycle this summer so stay tuned for more updates!

If you wish to accept this offer of admission, please promptly inform Averi Azar, the MES Assistant Director, by emailing averi.a.azar@evergreen.edu. Enclosed are directions to pay your tuition deposit. This <u>non-refundable \$100.00 deposit</u> reserves your space in the program. If you cannot accept this offer of admission, please email <u>graduateadmissions@evergreen.edu</u> to confirm your admissions decision in writing as soon as possible.

We are excited to meet you and share more about the program. We select the incoming cohort of 45 students with considerable care. We hope this opportunity to participate in our program will be meaningful to you. You will be part of a diverse, capable, and dedicated group of people.
