Position Description: The incumbent will assist Cooperative Monitoring Evaluation and Research (CMER) staff scientists in examining the frequency and spatial distribution Westside riparian management practices and identifying physical conditions that could potentially influence the effectiveness of Forest Practices Rules. The analysis will involve examining Forest Practices Applications for Type F riparian management prescriptions, creating spatial features with relevant attributes, gathering GIS datasets, and performing spatial analyses that can be used to identify target populations for effectiveness research. The incumbent may also be asked to create maps or perform spatial analyses in support of other projects as time allows.

Qualifications: The incumbent should have successfully completed the MES "Advanced GIS" or "GIS and Spatial Analysis" course at The Evergreen State College.
