

MPA CURRICULUM

Evergreen's MPA degree consists of 60 credits. Students complete 36 credits in core coursework with the remaining 24 credits determined by their concentrations of choice.

APPLYING TO THE MPA PROGRAM

New students are admitted to begin the MPA program in the fall quarter only. We admit new students in the Public and Nonprofit Administration and Public Policy concentrations every year. A new cohort of students in the Tribal Governance concentration begins every other year, in even-numbered years.

- Completed BA or BS degree before you begin MPA coursework in the fall
- 3.0 GPA for the last 90 quarter-hours or 60 semester-hours of undergraduate or graduate coursework We can waive this requirement for otherwise well-qualified candidates
- Excellent writing, analytical and communication skills
- Introductory statistics class many options are available May be completed after admission, as late as the summer before entering the program
