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# WHY GET AN MPA DEGREE?

## PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION AT EVERGREEN

Evergreen's Master of Public Administration (MPA) program prepares students to effectively serve the public good. Students in the program study current issues in an interdisciplinary context, learning the most important aspects of governance, management, and policy. Graduates go on to careers in the public sector, business, and nonprofit organizations as leaders, managers, analysts, and effective advocates for change.

## THE VALUE OF AN MPA FROM EVERGREEN

- Earn a highly usable degree from a nationally recognized institution.
- Acquire many practical skills for today's workplace.
- Focus on socially just public service, applicable to every field.
- Learn in small classes taught by interdisciplinary faculty teams that address the complexity of contemporary public problems.
- Form strong friendships and professional relationships with a cohort of students who move through core coursework together.
- Choose from three concentrations: Public and Nonprofit Administration, Public Policy, and the nation's only Tribal Governance concentration.
- Based in the state's capitol for valuable exposure to government and supporting organizations.

## AFFORDABLE

- Evergreen's tuition runs about half the cost of comparable MPA programs in the Northwest.
- Most students admitted to the MPA program are eligible for some form of financial aid.
- Course schedules allow for students to work full- or part-time jobs.
- The GRE is not require for admission.

# WHAT YOU LEARN HERE

## MPA CURRICULUM

Evergreen's MPA degree consists of 60 credits. Students complete 36 credits in core coursework with the remaining 24 credits determined by their concentrations of choice.

**Core Programs** are team taught by faculty with different specializations in public administration. In each quarter of Core, students earn six credit hours, for a total of 36 credits over two years.

**First-Year Core** is designed to give students the foundations of public administration. Students acquire the knowledge, skills, and abilities to lead others and to manage organizations in the public, nonprofit, tribal, and private sectors.

**Second-Year Core** prepares students in practical analytical skills and research techniques. Their experience is showcased in a required capstone or applied demonstration project involving organizations within the region.

**Elective Courses** allow students to tailor their degree to their particular interests. Individual study, internships, and other approved graduate courses build upon the rich offerings in leadership, management, policy, ethics, human resources, and other disciplines offered through the program.

## CONCENTRATION



### TRIBAL GOVERNANCE

Develops administrators who can assist tribal governments and the public agencies with which tribes interact. Students take a series of courses focusing on issues of critical importance to tribes. Courses are taught in an intensive format, meeting five sessions each quarter.

### PUBLIC & NONPROFIT ADMINISTRATION

Students prepare for careers as administrators in public or nonprofit organizations. Electives are offered in areas such as strategic planning, human resources, leadership and ethics, multicultural competencies, and nonprofit management.

Electives	24 credits
Total credits for degree	60 credits



### PUBLIC POLICY

Students prepare for, or advance in, positions as policy analysts, budget analysts, or evaluators. Students complete two public policy courses. Electives are offered in areas such as health policy, poverty policy, education policy, environmental policy, and energy policy.

Advanced Research Methods	4 credits
Electives	16 credits
Total credits for degree	60 credits

# HOW TO APPLY

## APPLYING TO THE MPA PROGRAM

New students are admitted to begin the MPA program in the fall quarter only. We admit new students in the Public and Nonprofit Administration and Public Policy concentrations every year. A new cohort of students in the Tribal Governance concentration begins every other year, in even-numbered years.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- **Completed BA or BS degree before you begin MPA coursework in the fall**
- **3.0 GPA for the last 90 quarter-hours or 60 semester-hours of undergraduate or graduate coursework**  
*We can waive this requirement for otherwise well-qualified candidates*
- **Excellent writing, analytical and communication skills**
- **Introductory statistics class – many options are available**  
*May be completed after admission, as late as the summer before entering the program*
