The Master of Public Administration Program makes available tuition wavers, scholarships, fellowships, work-study and other aid to persons admitted to the MPA program. This packet describes financial opportunities available for the 2010-11 academic year. The MPA program makes a significant effort to award aid to as many students as possible, contingent upon the availability of funds. These awards are provided **in addition** to other "need-based" financial aid offered through The Evergreen State College Financial Aid Office (360-867-6205).

Instructions for the MPA Financial Assistance Awards Application Process

- Complete and submit the 2010-11 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon as possible after January 1, 2010. The **priority deadline is March 15, 2010**. Follow the instructions listed on the "Financial Aid for Graduate Students" page of the Evergreen Financial Aid website: http://www.evergreen.edu/financialaid/graduate_finaid.htm (in the link there is an underscore "_" between "graduate" and "finaid") Note that Evergreen's Title IV school code is 008155.
- Complete the Evergreen Financial Aid Data Sheet and submit it to Evergreen's Financial Aid Office. As above, follow the instructions listed on the "Financial Aid for Graduate Students" page of the Evergreen Financial Aid website:

Note that "financial need" is determined by Evergreen's Financial Aid Office after receipt and processing of the FAFSA. If you are applying for one or more financial assistance awards for which financial need is a consideration (see award descriptions, under "Criteria"), you **must** complete the FAFSA, and **your application cannot be considered in the MPA Financial Aid award process until your FAFSA is on file.** Since funds are limited, we strongly suggest that you submit your FAFSA to the processor and the Financial Aid Data Sheet to the Office of Financial Aid as early as possible after January 1, 2010.

As stated above, **Evergreen's priority FAFSA deadline is March 15, 2010**. This means that to have your file reviewed in the first awarding cycle, the Financial Aid Office must receive your complete and valid FAFSA information before March 15th. It does **not** mean that you will be unable to receive financial aid next year if you do not meet the deadline, but in order to receive the best possible award, and to know at the earliest possible date (for planning purposes) what your offer will be, make sure that your FAFSA information gets to us by March 15th. Note that using estimated 2009 tax information is acceptable.

- Complete and submit the one page "MPA Financial Assistance Awards Application Form" (MPA FAAAF) <u>and</u> all materials required for the specific awards for which you are applying: a letter of intent addressing the criteria of the awards, letters of recommendation, etc. See the individual award descriptions on the following pages for details. Submitting the MPA FAAAF plus just one letter of intent is sufficient to apply for most awards see award descriptions for exceptions. A printed copy of the MPA FAAAF plus all required materials to the MPA Program must be received by May 3, 2010 (see complete address on page 1 and on MPA FAAAF). Emailed and faxed materials are not accepted.
- ☐ If you have not already done so, **apply for admission** to the MPA program. You will not be awarded aid until you are offered admission to the college.

Preference for MPA financial assistance awards will be given to applicants who will be: (1) enrolled full-time (at least 8 Evergreen graduate credits per quarter) **and** (2) enrolled in 1st or 2nd year MPA core courses.

May 3, 2010 is the deadline for all application materials to be on file in Evergreen's Financial Aid Office and to submit "hard" copies of the MPA FAAAF and all required

materials. Awards applications may be submitted after this date, but available funds may be exhausted or very limited. Note that tuition and fees for 2010-2011 are subject to change by the Washington State Legislature. Notification of awards begins <u>after June 10, 2010</u>.

Description of MPA Financial Assistance Awards

Submit just one (1) Letter of Intent to apply for any or all of the awards listed below. In your Letter of Intent mention the name of each award for which you are applying and demonstrate how you meet each award's specific criteria. The Letter of Intent should not exceed three (3) pages. Address the Letter of Intent to the Selection Committee:

AMERICORPS EDUCATION AWARD - FAFSA is NOT required

Up to one quarter of resident tuition.

Criteria:

 Demonstrated commitment to community service and explanation of how AmeriCorps and the Education Award have impacted your desire to attend graduate school.

Special requirement:

 In addition to the Letter of Intent, submit one (1) letter of recommendation, preferably from an AmeriCorps supervisor, supporting your application, and evidence of having completed one year of service and received the full AmeriCorps education award (in 2007-08 = \$4,725).

EVERGREEN ALUMNI ASSOCIATION GRADUATE AWARD

An award of \$1,000 will be awarded to one applicant.

Criteria:

- Primary consideration given to commitment to chosen field of study and reasons for selecting Evergreen for graduate study
- Secondary consideration given to financial need.

EVERGREEN FOUNDATION GRADUATE AWARDS

Approximately \$7,500 will be distributed among several applicants.

Criteria:

Primary consideration given to financial need.

HEARST NATIVE AMERICAN SCHOLARSHIP

Approximately \$15,000 will be distributed to one or more applicants. First priority is given to Native American students in Evergreen's MIT (Master's in Teaching) or MEd (Master's of Education) programs. After funds are allocated to eligible MIT and MEd students, Native American students in other Evergreen graduate programs (MPA and MES) will be considered for any remaining funds.

Criteria:

- Primary consideration given to Native American students with a documented commitment to a Native American community and the education of Native American youth.
- Secondary consideration given to Native American students with a documented commitment to a Native American community.

JOHN WALKER FELLOWSHIP

An award of \$400 is awarded to one female applicant, preference given to women of color and/or over thirty.

Criteria:

- Primary consideration given to demonstrated commitment to continued intellectual and professional development.
- Secondary consideration given to financial need.

JUDGE FULLER GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP -- FAFSA is NOT required

Approximately \$1,400 will be awarded to an applicant who best demonstrates his/her interest in one or more of the following areas:

Criteria:

 Describe how your previous volunteer or work experience; past, current or proposed course of study; and/or career goals in education, public policy, health, welfare, or the environment have benefited or intend to benefit young children living in or near poverty conditions. Explain clearly since the selection committee may not consist of specialists in your field.

MPA TRIBAL GOVERNANCE AWARD

Approximately \$5,000 will be distributed to one or more applicants in the Tribal Governance concentration.

Criteria:

- Primary consideration will be given to the applicant's potential to use their education and experience to benefit tribal or indigenous communities.
- Secondary consideration is financial need.

Special requirement:

Please also state in your Letter of Intent if you have received or expect to receive
educational funding from tribal governments or other sources that will be used to
support your completion of the MPA degree.

WASHINGTON STATE RESIDENT TUITION WAIVER

Funds from twelve one quarter tuition waivers will be divided among several applicants who are Washington residents.

Criteria:

- Primary consideration given to students based on the strength of MPA application and/or demonstration of high potential within the program.
- Secondary consideration given to financial need.

Non-Resident Tuition Waiver

Awarded to applicants who are out-of-state residents.

Criteria:

- Primary consideration given to students based on the strength of MPA application and/or demonstration of high potential within the program.
- Secondary consideration given to financial need.

WORK/STUDY

Work/Study funds come from the U.S. Department of Education, the State of Washington or The Evergreen State College. Work/Study funds can be used for on campus jobs or off-campus jobs with not-for-profit entities, including federal, state and local government agencies and eligible non-profit organizations. Work/Study awardees are responsible for finding their own work/study positions. *Criteria:*

Primary consideration given to financial need.
