In the current second year Core, we have at least 4 TESC employees (last term it was 5)...that's 2 fewer FTEs...

Besides, is the name of the game increasing FTE beyond the already increased rates? Are our increases not good enough?

Hi Don,

I pulled together a little comparison of fte and headcount growth over the past four years for each graduate program. In the chart and the subsequent detail of MPA student enrollment patterns, I've tried to illustrate the issues around reducing MPA core to 4 credits. There are clearly assumptions built in to the tuition and fte issues that can be tinkered with further. But essentially, it appears that if core had been offered at 6

credits, (and it didn't scare too many students away), the fte growth in MPA would have been around 29 FTE over the past four years, which is very comparable to their actual headcount growth.

Please ask if you have questions about this data. I've simply added the new presentation format as an additional worksheet "four yr hc fte trend" in the same excel file of graduate history stats I sent you earlier this year.
